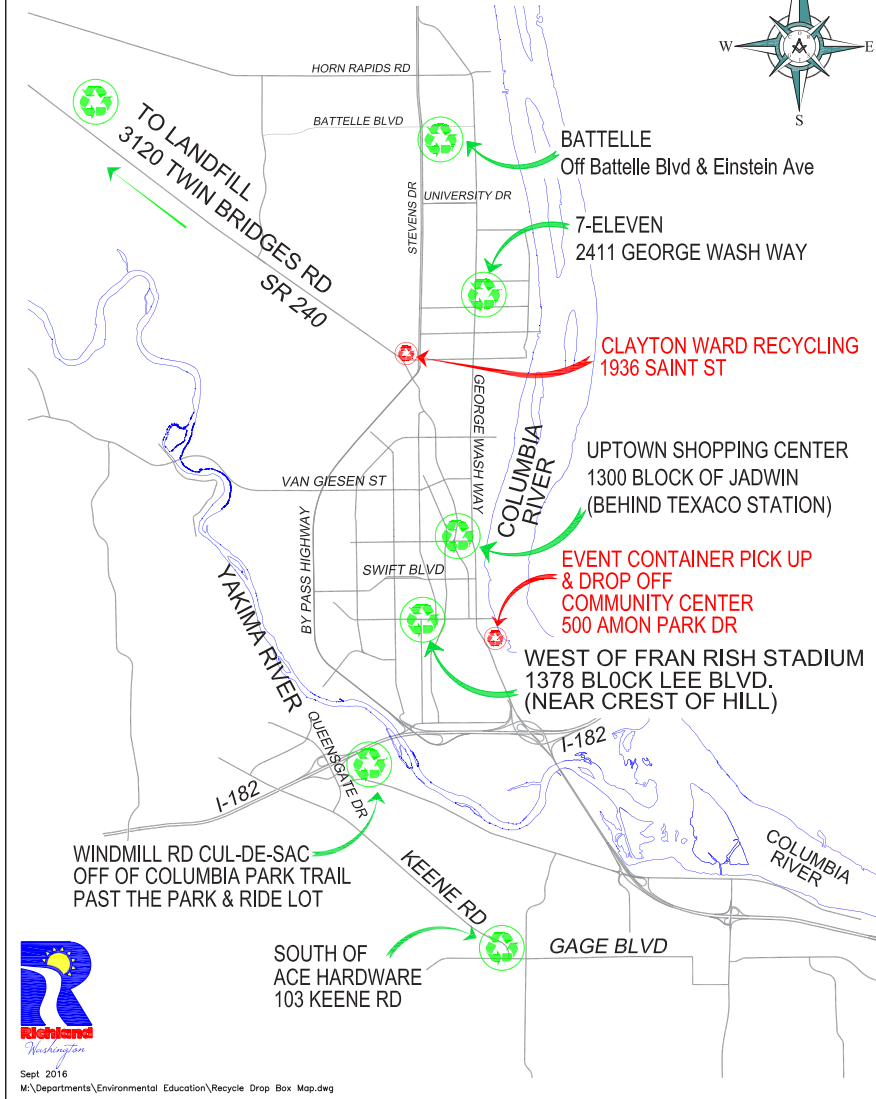

IT'S EASY TO RECYCLE IN RICHLAND

Curbside & Drop Box Programs

Richland Residents can recycle at the curb, in drop boxes, or by visiting Clayton Ward Recycling. Recycling saves energy and natural resources, creates jobs, saves landfill space, and preserves the quality of our environment.

Curbside Recycling

For \$6.60 a month you receive a 100 gallon, blue, recycling bin which is emptied curbside every other week, on the same day as trash. To enroll, call 942-7700 or go online at www.ci.richland.wa.us/recycle.

Drop Box or Recycling Center

Collect recyclables at home and take to a drop box or recycling center. Materials must be separated. Collect in a cardboard box or paper sack and empty in one of eight drop boxes or take to Clayton Ward Recycling (map on back). Be sure to combine it with another trip to conserve gasoline.

WHERE TO TAKE YOUR RECYCLABLES

Drop Boxes

Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, scrap paper, phonebooks, cardboard, plastic containers marked with a 1 or 2 on the bottom, glass bottles and jars, and tin and aluminum may be recycled in Richland. Drop boxes are placed throughout Richland and are usually in place 24-hours a day, seven days a week. Please direct questions or concerns to Clayton Ward Recycling, 582-8277.

Horn Rapids Landfill

The Landfill has recycling drop boxes available. Wood waste, used tires, appliances, and other white goods are accepted for a fee. The Landfill is located at 3102 Twin Bridges Road, off State Route 240. Business hours are 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday. March - October they are also open on Sundays. To contact the landfill, call 942-7700.

Clayton Ward Recycling Center

Drop off recyclables during business hours and earn \$\$\$. The recycling center is located at 1936 Saint Street, 375-4086.

Preparing Materials for Recycling

Curbside

Place all items identified below, EXCEPT glass, in the blue recycling container. Plastics in curbside: Rinse and flatten containers with a neck (milk, water, juice, sports drinks, salad dressings, etc.) Caps can be included if bottle is flattened before attaching lid. Plastic aerosol lids are accepted. No butter/yogurt tubs are accepted at this time.

Drop Box or Recycling Center

Items taken to the drop box or the recycling center should be rinsed, flattened, and separated. Drop boxes have co-mingled compartments for plastic 1 and 2, flattened cardboard, tin and aluminum, and glass of all colors.

Scrap Paper

Includes newspapers, magazine, catalogs & phonebooks. White, colored, copy, fax and computer paper; junk mail, envelopes, paper bags, pressboard (cereal, cracker, rice and shoe boxes; paper cores), file folders, wrapping paper, greeting cards, paper egg cartons, and frozen entree boxes.

Glass Jars and Bottles

Rinsed glass of any color can be co-mingled. Glass is not allowed in the curbside program. Lids can be recycled with tin.

Tin and Aluminum Cans

Rinse and flatten if possible; clean aluminum foil, pie tins, gum and mint tins. Lids from jars and bottles are accepted.

Cardboard and Plastic #1 & #2

Place together in drop boxes. Flattened cardboard, brown paper bags, plastic PET, and HDPE containers (bottles, no tubs).

Household Hazardous Waste Disposal

Residents can bring used motor oil, cooking oil, vehicle batteries, propane tanks, propane canisters and antifreeze to collection areas at the Horn Rapids Landfill. Benton County manages Household Hazardous Waste collection for Richland. Safely store other hazardous material until a collection event is announced. Questions can be directed to 736-3084 x5682.

Computer and TVs

You may drop off used computers, monitors, printers, and laptops at any Goodwill Industries Collection Center or to Clayton Ward Recycling Center.
